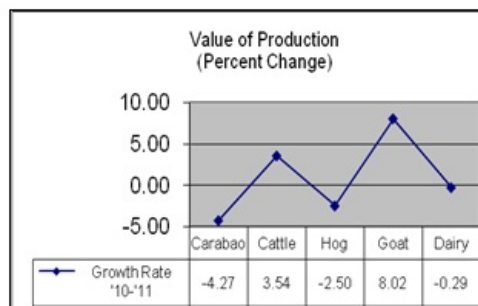
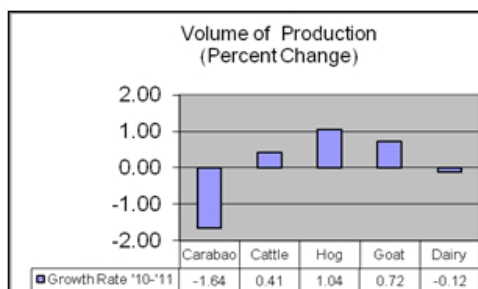


Update on Performance of Philippine Dairy Production January – June 2011

Highlights:

Based on the report of the Bureau of Agricultural Statistics (BAS), the livestock production recorded a 0.85 percent growth. The sector accounted for 15.27 percent of total agricultural production. The gross value of livestock production was P103.10 billion at current prices. This represented a 1.64 percent reduction from last year's record. Only cattle and goat registered an increased production and prices that pushed their gross earnings up by 3.54 percent and 8.02 percent respectively.

Both carabao and dairy registered a decline in volume and value of production. Dairy's output dropped by 0.12% which pulled down gross value by 0.29%. Animals on the milk line were affected by hot weather in the first quarter. Carabao production declined by 1.64% and resulted into significant loss in value (4.27%)

Total dairy production maintained the 8 thousand MT-level while still grossing at P240 million-mark. . On the average, farm gate price of dairy reached only to P29.72 per liter.

The NDA-assisted dairy projects shared 2/3 (or equivalent to 5.65 thousand MT) to the total national milk output.
